Allow me to share a truly inspiring story of how your unwavering support has changed the life of a precious 8-month-old orphaned baby in Bangladesh.

This little girl had been living with a debilitating condition since birth. Pain and swelling in her lower extremities prevented her from crawling and developing normally. In search of aid but without the means to pay, a caregiver brought her to the Filaria and General Hospital in Dhaka.

Thanks to your support of World Telehealth Initiative, the hospital has access to clinical specialists around the world. Within a short time, an exemplary multidisciplinary team from WTI's network of healthcare professionals collaborated to offer the best possible treatment recommendations for her rare condition.

It was determined that lymphatic massage and compression therapy could significantly enhance her quality of life, so WTI added a certified lymphedema therapist to the care team. From across the world, via telehealth, the therapist taught a room full of clinicians in Bangladesh the Vodder technique that has shown incredible results for patients like this baby girl.

Without our program in Bangladesh, this endearing child would likely have been unable to access the specialized care she desperately needed.

Donors like you enable life-changing healthcare access for those in need. Your generosity made a profound difference in this little girl's life, as well as countless others, and we are deeply grateful.



GLOBAL IMPACT

World Telehealth Initiative upskills clinicians in low-resource areas with training and learning opportunities not otherwise available. As local providers grow in their profession, healthcare access is increased in their communities. The following are three standout programs from 2022.



Kenya

Longisa County Referral Hospital lacks many medical specialists that the community needs. World Telehealth Initiative provides opportunities for clinicians at the hospital to learn more about various medical specialties and supports them in applying those new skills to patients.



Ukraine

When the conflict in Ukraine began, World Telehealth Initiative quickly mobilized to care for patients in critical condition and support Ukrainian clinicians. With 18 programs in Ukraine, we support health facilities across the country and on the front lines in vital specialties such as trauma and neurosurgery.



Nigeria

The Opoji Comprehensive Health Center was previously closed. Through our program, it reopened and filled with local clinicians regularly hosting clinics for the community. We provided telehealth sessions with local medical students and general practitioners to grow their knowledge base in various medical specialties.
